## President's Message

Members,

A couple competitors have come forward with concerns regarding the footing at the NEC. I have requested an additional tractor and drag from the NEC. They have assured me that this will not be a problem and they will look into renting the additional equipment. Having two tractors to drag arenas will be more efficient and help the footing from being packed down. There will be an additional cost to SLADS for this, as we will have to pay for the rental equipment. We want to make sure our dressage horses are performing on sufficient footing. Please remember, the NEC holds numerous shows including jumping, reining, western pleasure, and dressage. These diverse disciplines require different amounts of footing. SLADS and the NEC will work together to make sure there is adequate time to drag rings and ensure the safety of our equine partners.

We've got a great variety of equestrians on the board this year. Many of them are speaking up on behalf of other SLADS members. I want you all to know that we care about you, your horses, and what **YOU** want out of the club. Everyone is welcome to attend general membership meetings. If you have concerns, complaints, or positive feedback to share...bring it with you! We want to hear from you. We can't improve unless you are part of the process.

Sandi Lewis is working on our new website. Along with upcoming general membership meeting dates, we will also post the monthly agenda for the membership meetings. # February Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

## Arabian Horse Show Association:

Sandy Lewis spoke on behalf of the Arabian Horse Association's desire to work more collaboratively with SLADS, since so many Arabian horses compete in both breed and SLADS shows. SLADS agreed to sponsor 4 classes and advertise SLADS by hanging our banner at the Arabian Horse Association's upcoming show on March 16 – 18 at the NEC.

## Website:

Sandy Lewis also presented information on the upgrade and re-vamping of the SLADS website. The new website will have approximately 33 pages and there is a \$500.00 set up fee. We discussed several options for our hosting provider and selected yahoo for 24 months. The annual fee for this will be the same as we are currently paying, but the new site will be more amenable to updating and changing than our current one. Sandy will have something for us to look at by the next meeting.

## Regionals:

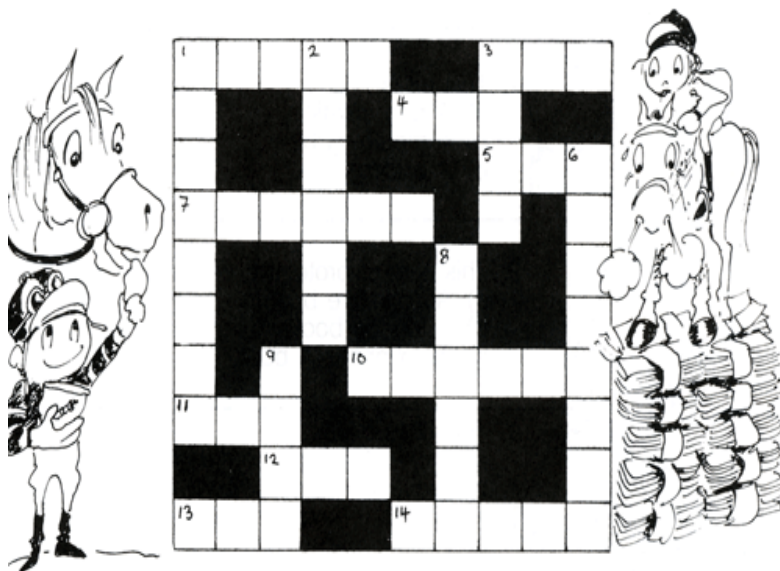
Via conference call, we discussed progress in hiring judges for the regional championships and concerns about the footing in the indoor arenas with our show manager, Sandy Donovan. Colleen has already broached the footing issue with the NEC management and they will not allow any additives to be introduced to the existing footing, as was suggested by a member. Sandy will work with the NEC staff to ensure adequate time is available for all rings to be dragged and fluffed up more frequently throughout the show. Colleen will also speak with them about the possibility of bringing in some sand to prevent the material from packing down. Great American Insurance is sponsoring the competition, so they will receive priority for vendor booth space, VIP seating and parking. Sandy is now recruiting for a vet on call. Dawn Fee White will be responsible for securing prizes, and we discussed several options. It was decided to let winners pick their favorite from 2-3 different types of prizes.

## Education:

Ann Murphy is working on getting a \$500.00 education grant from USDF to underwrite this year's symposiums, and Michelle Inman will be coordinating them. Since most of our members compete at 1<sup>st</sup> level or below, it was suggested that a new section be added to the newsletter about the rules for showing. The new column will provide members with information about such topics as what types of whips, bits, spurs, and saddlery are permitted in the show ring, qualifications for the regionals, and other basic information for people beginning to show. Gerri Muldrow will be writing the column.

## Volunteer Info from Region 4 Director, Sarah Patrick

I received an email from Sarah and thought it would be nice to share the following information with our membership:

“Recently I polled the members of the Region 4 listserv to find out about Volunteer Programs in Region 4. We had 27 responses. Twenty-nine percent of respondents said their GMO has a volunteer program. How do the other 61% of GMOs recruit, train, and recognize volunteers, I wonder? The most common amount of time they said they spent volunteering on dressage related activities was 20 or more hours per year (these were dedicated GMO members!) and, yes, there was interest in having volunteer recognition and/or prizes through the Region (18%) and/or through USDF (11%). The National Volunteer Week is April 15-21 so let's generate some discussion/recognition of Region 4 volunteers through the listserv. Know someone you want to 'pat on the back'? Send a few sentences to me via the listserv or privately. I'll put a volunteer recognition section in the next Region 4 newsletter.”

## News from The Dressage Foundation

The Olympic Dream Program for Advanced Young Riders  
--funded and administered by The Dressage Foundation

The Dressage Foundation Advanced Young Rider Olympic Dream Program is ready to go for the seventh year! The concept of the program evolved as a result of former Olympian Michael Poulin's wish to offer an opportunity for gifted Young Riders to enhance their understanding of dressage theory through a European tour. The program is both funded and administered by The Dressage Foundation of which Poulin is a National Board Member.

The program is open to USDF Advanced Young Riders (riding at Fourth Level or above) who are 16-21 years of age and 22-year-old graduates of the 2006 Advanced Young Rider Program. Participation in the North American Young Rider Championship is not required.

A Selection Committee comprised of leading American dressage persons selects from applicants who have submitted an extensive application including an essay and written recommendations. Selection is based solely on merit, riding proficiency and commitment to training in the sport of dressage and is based on the candidates' applications, essays and written recommendations.

In 2007 the four successful candidates will be in Europe from approximately July 11<sup>th</sup> until July 21<sup>st</sup>. Their journey will include the European Young Rider Dressage Championships in Nussloch, Germany. Following the show, the current plan is to visit Ingrid Klimke, Jean Bemelmans, Hubertus Schmidt and American team coach, Klaus Balkenhol—depending upon each trainer's availability. While traveling, the young riders will record their observations in daily journals and chronicle the events with photos and video to share with their home dressage organizations. This year's chaperones will be Sharon Poulin (FL) and Sarah Martin (CO).

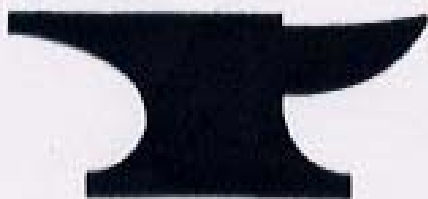

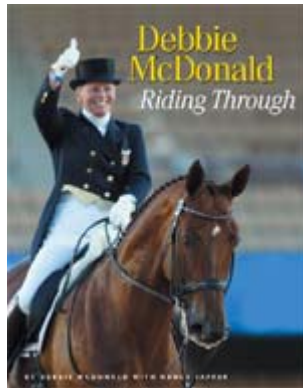
